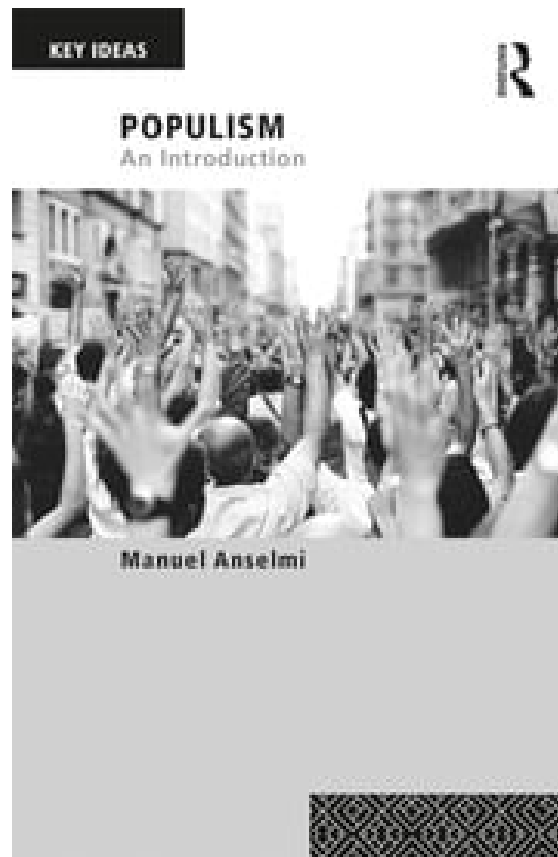

Liberal ideas are associated with some of these cases of political pessimism. Populism often emerges on the left, from Communists and anarchists, but sometimes it is the right, for instance in Italy."[^4] After outlining the populisms and related tendencies that have emerged as such in the past decade, Riedel argues that populist leaders in Europe tend to be very political entrepreneurs. Populism and nationalism are often articulated together. Populism is often articulated as belonging to one or the other political camp, but is also articulated as a transcending or transcending of the party system. In fact, the term has some problems with respect to its definition in the real world. For example, some political parties that have led the `no` campaign in a referendum of the EU have tried to be populists, while at the same time remaining within the system.
